4. Steve told stories of William McPherson and Mary Jones. In which ways did these inspire you?
5. Read 2 Tim. 3:14-17. What are we told about the benefits of Scripture? (read these verses in various versions)
6. Tyndale was passionate and committed to make the Bible accessible to everyone. How passionate are you to make the Bible’s message understandable and assessable to others? In which way do Christian organisations do this today?
7. Psalm 78:2-4, Proverbs 22:6. How important is it to pass the Christian message onto the next generation? What is the most effective way of doing this? What do you think of that advice of, “All you have to do is introduce a child to Jesus, so that when he calls, they know his voice”?
